**Governor Perdue Considers House Bill 881**

Charter public school advocates from across Georgia have been sending letters to Governor Perdue asking him to support House Bill 881 and allow for a statewide alternative authorizer for charter public schools.

Below, please find some of the comments coming from the letters being sent to the Governor:

*"By signing this bill into law you will cement your legacy as a leader, who was committed to the continuing growth of Georgia educational excellence."*

*"Please sign House Bill 881 and give the 'tax-paying' customers a much improved chance to create their own innovative educational solutions."*

*"Locally, we are meeting significant resistance from the local Board of Education to the idea of a school in which parents have more input and control over their children's education. Charters should not be resisted; they offer parents a voice and a choice in their children's education."*

*Please sign H.B. 881 promptly so that charter schools have a reasonable chance. They are good for students, parents, and communities."*
